Key Findings

BLURRED LINES

The distinction between refugees and migrants in Brazil is often unclear, leading to challenges in accessing the appropriate protection and support.



OPERATION WELCOME

While the Operation Welcome initiative aims to help Venezuelan refugees, its implementation has been criticized for militarization and a lack of coordination.



DECENT WORK

Refugees and migrants in Brazil often struggle to access decent work, facing challenges with formalization, discrimination, and a lack of support.



INTERIORIZATION PROGRAM

The Interiorization Program aims to relocate refugees to different parts of Brazil, but lacks effective monitoring and coordination with local authorities, resulting in limited success.



Policy Recommendations

LEGAL DEADLINES

Establish legal deadlines in RSD procedures to ensure predictability and efficiency.



CIVILIAN LEAD

Shift the focus of Operation Welcome towards international protection and asylum, led by civil authorities.



FEDERAL COORDINATION

Promote coordination between federal, state, and municipal governments to support refugees and migrants.



TRANSPARENCY

Ensure transparency and accountability in the interiorization process, promoting autonomy and equal opportunities for all.



WOMEN'S RIGHTS

Offer incentives for the employability of migrant and refugee women, addressing childcare and gender-based violence.



DIPLOMA RECOGNITION

Facilitate the recognition of titles and diplomas to help migrants and refugees find suitable employment.
