


## Creating an Inclusive Refugee Response in Jordan

This infographic presents key insights on creating an inclusive refugee response in Jordan, focusing on discrimination faced by non-Syrian refugees and the challenges around decent work.



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## Key Findings

### DISCRIMINATION

Non-Syrian refugees face discrimination and exclusion from humanitarian aid and asylum systems. E.g., Iraqis, Somalis, Sudanese, and Yemenis cannot register with UNHCR.



### LABOUR MARKET ACCESS

Syrians have been able to access work permits under the Jordan Compact, but all nationalities face barriers to decent work.

Work permits alone do not guarantee job opportunities or decent conditions.



## Policy Recommendations

### ONE REFUGEE APPROACH

Treat all refugees equally based on needs, not nationality.

Include all nationalities in the Jordan Response Plan.



### IMPROVE WORK CONDITIONS

Shift from issuing work permits to improving working conditions

Ensure fair access to work permits for all nationalities.
